The Hōonkō Service is the memorial service of the founder of Shin Buddhism, Shinran, who passed away on January 16, 1263, at the age of 90. For Shinran's 33rd memorial service, Kakunyō Shōnin, the 3rd Monshu (head priest) of Hongwanji mother temple decided on the system of the ceremony to praise Shinran's virtue. Since then, for over 700 years, Shin Buddhists have observed the Hōonkō service for Shinran, allowing us to recall and appreciate the Teachings. 
Finally into December, our final service of the year was also marked by the usual ambitious lunch and of course, bingo.

Encountering The Buddha:

108 Teachings of Buddha

Continued from Dec 2017 Bodhi Mind Issue #413 "11. Created by Conditions, Changed by Conditions"

Everything in the world arises not only because of causes but also due to conditions. So under different conditions, everything ends up changing. In the Sutra of *Queen Srimālā* (Jpn. *Shōmangyō*), it is taught:

The rain falls, the wind blows, flowers bloom, and leaves fall. Everything arises, depending on conditions, and everything perishes depending on conditions. This body of mine was born through the conditions of my parents, it is sustained by the food I eat, and my mind is nurtured by my experiences and knowledge. Therefore, both my body and my mind arise depending on conditions, and, of course, they are transformed depending on conditions.

The sutra further clarifies this point by saying:

Just as a net is made of meshes connected ed together, all things are connected together.

It s mistaken to think that each mesh of the net exists independently.
