<u>"As It Is"</u>



Already half of the year of 2023 is about to pass. I hope this message finds you well and enjoying the summer. While I am writing this article, the temperature has dropped to around 20 degrees. I wish to have warm weather return, but when it gets too hot, I would like the temperature to cool down a little bit. That reveals to me my self centeredness. I would like to see things as I wish. I would like to share a story that is a good lesson for us to reflect on.

In Kyoto, there was a very famous pine tree called Very Tortuous (or spiral) Pine (Nana magari no matsu). A famous Zen monk, Ikkyu, put up a sign just in front of the pine tree which announced: "I am going to give a great sum of gold to the person who can see this pine tree straight".

Everybody pondered how such a twisted tree could be seen straight. Some people thought that from some angle the tree could be seen straight. After some time, someone told Jodo Shinshu (Pure Land) Buddhist minister, Rennyo, about the sign.

Rennyo, without seeing the tree, said that he knew the answer and asked for the gold. Ikkyu said that on the reverse side of the board there was a warning: "This is not valid for Rennyo".

However, when they asked Rennyo for the answer, he replied: "The

answer is very simple. The way to see this tree straight is to recognize that it is twisted."

Message from the VBT Board

We will be applying for a City of Vancouver grant to offset our costs to repair damage to our exterior east wall caused by the demolition. We are also pursuing the possibility of getting funding from the Japanese Legacy Foundation to provide additional monies for restoration expenses.

Next year, in 2024, our temple will be celebrating its 45th Anniversary since replacing the old temple with our present one. It was in November of 1979 that a dedication of our new temple was held.

With the summer season looming, plans for our annual Obon Festival are underway. They include street odori dancing and refreshment sales. In addition, the temple plans to be a participant in the annual Powell Street Festival held in Oppenheimer Park. We are in need of people to assist us in moving tables, chairs, etc. Please contact our temple if you are able to help for even a few hours.

The AGM of the JSBTC was held recently at Steveston Buddhist Temple. In recent years, due to Covid, assessments to temples had been reduced from the usual \$80 per member. Now that things are more or less back to normal, the assessments for 2023 and 2024 will be increased to \$100 per member.


