# The View From the Back

If one walks looking far ahead and pays no attention to the ground beneath his eyes, he will stumble. If one gazes critically upon others and forgets to look into himself, he will bring tragedy upon himself.

(Rennyo Shonin)

It is hard to believe that February is ending, and we are entering the third month of 2024. How time flies! This quotation by Rennyo Shinin (1415–1499 - who was the 8<sup>th</sup> head

priest of the Hongwan-ji Temple) has practical applications as well as spiritual ones. We are always planning for the future; working hard, setting up trusts, buying insurance policies against any future contingency, making sure that we leave an inheritance for future generations. It is an admirable quality, but it is not an attitude that is effective in all cases, especially when it comes to religion in general, and Jodo Shinshu in particular.

Buddhism, as the Nembutsu, is not for us, or for my family, or for my children... it is for me alone. It is for me alone now... not tomorrow... or the day after. Buddhism is always taught and really understood by ushiro sugata (ie. the view from the back). That is to say, by living by example rather than intellectual theories. Children do what we do rather than what we say. They watch us from the back and imitate our actions.

As we observe our temple's 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we are reminded of this important message. One day, we will be seen by ushiro sugata (viewed from the back). Let us continue to rejoice and share the Buddha-Dharma.

## Ochigo - Sunday, April 14, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. (10:00 am in the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor class room for participants)

"Chigo" refers to children ages three to twelve. ("o" is an honorific prefex.) According to tradition, noble households in Japan sent their children to temples for their education. While attending, children participated in the temple festivals and ceremonies, often dressing up to represent celestial beings.

Both boys and girls wear a robe with long, wide sleeves over a hakama or loose trousers, and the ancient make-up of the nobility which consists of two black dots just above the space between the eyebrows. The costume is differentiated between boys and girls by a stiff hat for boys and a crown of the phoenix bird for girls.

The VBT will provide an opportunity for children to participate in this ceremonial procession at its anniversary ceremony to be held on April 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at the VBT. \*\*\* Please bring a Yukata or white shirt to be worn under the costume.


